Annual Alberta Education Surveys

SATISFACTION SURVEY - by telephone January to March

As in previous years, the Ministry of Education will be conducting its annual stakeholder satisfaction telephone surveys to collect public and other stakeholder perceptions of Alberta's education system. You may be contacted by Advanis Inc., an Alberta-based firm, that will administer the telephone surveys beginning January 5, 2018 and ending March 30, 2018. The surveys gather responses from a random sample of parents, the general public, high school students, teachers, principals, superintendents and school board trustees in the province. The total number of completed surveys will be over 6,000, ensuring that survey results for each of the 10 respondent groups are statistically representative. The survey responses are completely confidential, and only aggregate data will be reported.

In addition to telephone surveys, this year Alberta Education is piloting online surveys of teachers and the public using the same survey instruments. This is being done to examine alternatives to the existing telephone survey methodology.

The purpose of the surveys is to determine stakeholders' satisfaction with:

- the overall quality of the education system;
- the education system meeting the needs of students and supporting our society and the economy;
- schools providing a safe, caring and inclusive environment for students;
- preparation of students for lifelong learning, employment and active citizenship;
- the education system having effective working relationships with partners and stakeholders;

leadership and continuous improvement of the education system:

- knowledge, skills, abilities and other related attributes of recent high school graduates; and
- facilities and equipment in the education system.

Your participation is important, as it provides valuable information to help the ministry identify areas of strength and areas needing improvement, thus helping provide a more effective and accountable education system. Some survey results are also used in specific business plan performance measures and will be reported in the ministry's 2017/18 annual report.

Advanis Inc., an Alberta-based firm, has been contracted to administer the telephone surveys beginning January 5, 2018 and ending March 30, 2018. ACCOUNTABILITY PILLAR SURVEYS - January and February 2018

Parents of grade 10-12 students: Later this winter you will receive a copy of a survey by mail from Alberta Education. Please find attached a copy of the Minister's letter, "Invest in the Future" that will come with your mail.

As an annual check-up on the education system, the Accountability Pillar provides an opportunity for Alberta Education and school authorities to ensure that we are equipping students for success.

The Accountability Pillar uses a set of 16 indicators. Data on these indicators consists of surveys of students, parents and teachers on various aspects of education quality, student outcomes such as dropout and high school completion rates, and provincial assessments of student learning.

From January to the end of February, Alberta Education will be conducting the annual Accountability Pillar Survey.

In January, parents of students in grades 10 - 12 will receive a survey from Alberta Education and the attached letter from the Minister BY MAIL.

In February, students in grades 10 - 12 and all teachers will be completing their surveys online at school.

All surveys are anonymous and ask questions about experiences with your school. In addition to English and French, the parent survey is available in Chinese, Punjabi, Arabic, Blackfoot, Dene, Cree, Korean, Spanish, Tagalog and Urdu. If you require translation in another language please be in touch with alison.hancox@pallisersd.ab.ca who will help arrange translation services.

Your participation in the survey helps provide important information on the quality of education your child is receiving, so we encourage you to return your survey promptly.

Survey results will be available to school authorities in May 2018, and will be reported publicly as part of their 3-Year Education Plans and Annual Education Results Reports. More information: (780-427-6893 [toll free using 310-0000] or by email at reginia.yan@gov.ab.ca.





Friday March 23, 2018	Diploma courses must be completed including assignments and exams by this date for those writing in April to allow for assessment, feedback and review.
Friday April 6, 2018	Non-diploma courses deadline to hand in assignments for April reporting period
Friday April 20, 2018	Report cards are distributed. Courses completed will receive a final mark and be reported to Alberta Education. Courses in progress will receive a progress mark. Students continue to work until completed.
Friday June 1, 2018	Diploma courses must be completed including assignments and exams by this date for those writing in June to allow for assessment, feedback and review.
Friday June 8, 2018	Non-diploma courses deadline to hand in assignments for June reporting period
Friday June 22, 2018	Report cards are distributed. Courses completed will receive a final mark and be reported to Alberta Education. Courses in progress will receive a progress mark. Students continue to work until completed.

From Palliser Beyond Borders Principal: A note about the mastery learning process at Palliser Beyond Borders

Our goal is to empower all our students in all grades and courses in learning and assessment in a meaningful and effective manner. We support students through a process of mastery learning. If students do not show they understand at an acceptable level teachers will ask students to meet with them for additional instruction. We do not want to simply accept failing work and accept that a student will earn a failing mark. This means that students will have the flexibility to determine their completion dates. We do however establish dates for students to aim for so that if they need the credits earned on their transcripts for post secondary deadlines they can plan accordingly. This means some of our students may have received progress marks in June and are aiming to complete a course this fall. If this is true for you please be sure to apply to register in those courses so you don't lose time in September. Please speak to your Teacher Advisors at our Outreaches or our Career and Academic counselors in our Palliser Schools if you need help with application process or academic planning.



Starting a course with Palliser Beyond Borders?

We believe that students who follow these tips will be successful online learners:

- Make it a priority to read all your teacher's communication and introduce yourself to him or her. Students who build teaching and learning relationships with their teachers find the experience rewarding.
- The student role is to manage time wisely, identify ways you learn best and reach to demonstrate your understanding. See the table of deadline dates below.
- Calculate how many weeks left before you must finish the course and divide up by weeks what you have left to complete in your course.

- Commit to the schedule.
- Check your email and news feed daily.
- Attend the weekly Blackboard sessions and be prepared to engage in learning, formative assessment and benefit from the teaching process.
- Submit assignments as completed so you can engage formatively with your teacher to help you bump up your understanding.
- Pay attention to posted deadlines so you can plan your academic program.



Completing Courses and Exam Protocols - students please read

We want students to submit assignments regularly and follow our tips for successful online learning. Students can not submit a whole course the night before an exam or diploma exam and accept that it is ok to "take the bad mark". We feel bad if students don't do well on exams and want to support every effort for students to demonstrate their very best understanding in our courses.

Students: be aware that each course has different exam protocols depending on the subject. Be in touch with your teacher to book your exam writing. Organizing final exams requires a little coordination with your school to ensure we have a Palliser staff who will supervise and that the exam and password are made available to your school site. Please give your teacher one day notice to make the arrangements.

This includes the Outreaches. If Palliser staff is not available we will need to make Procter arrangements, which require forms and signatures.

Please note that courses need to be completed within one calendar year of the student's start date. These deadlines mean that all assignments and exams must be submitted on or before the date.


