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Who may enroll in this one-year program?

Students going into Grade 11 or 12 who are applying for this program must have HCS3000 Workplace Safety Systems and complete the following high school courses before completing the Pre-Employment Carpentry program:

- Math 10C or 10-3
- ELA 10-1 or 10-2

How do students earn a Pre-Employment Carpentry Certificate while in high school?

Students complete their High School Diploma requirements using SAIT Carpentry courses as CTS Credits. This program has been designed to fulfill requirements of Alberta Education, Alberta Apprenticeship & Industry Training, and the Pre-Employment Carpentry Program.

Are there any special program requirements?

Participants must be 15 years of age upon beginning the program. Students must understand this program is a two-semester commitment and that attendance is a high priority in this program. Interested students are eligible to challenge the Alberta Apprenticeship exam for first-year Carpenter Apprenticeship at the completion of the program.

Who will teach the courses?

SAIT instructors will deliver the program at the SAIT campus. Students will be supervised by a Palliser off-campus teacher.

When will the program take place?

The program is delivered at SAIT Main Campus four days a week, Monday to Thursday, from 8:30-11:30 a.m.

How do students get to SAIT?

Students are responsible for their own transportation to and from SAIT. LRT access takes students right onto campus. Parking is also available at a cost to the student.
